## Physical Plant and Equipment Levy Fact Sheet (PPEL)

This fact sheet contains answers to commonly asked questions relating to the upcoming physical plant and equipment levy vote.

**\*Is the 67-cent levy on assessed valuation or taxable valuation?**

The levy is on TAXABLE valuation. The question on the ballot refers to assessed valuation. This is due to legal requirements. The actual tax collected is based on taxable valuation, which is much lower than assessed valuation. The county assessor provides the following figures:

**\*How much per year will a successful PPEL vote raise for the school district?**

A successful vote will raise approximately an additional \$88,000 per year. Based on current valuations.

**\*Is there a time limit on this levy?**

Yes, the levy will run for ten years. At that time the school board will have the option to let the levy expire or they could ask for another vote to continue the levy.

**\*What are the plans for the use of these additional funds?**

Current plans are to refurbish three science labs, two computer labs, the elementary restroom, and add air conditioning to the kitchen area.

**\*What are the plans for the use of these additional funds?**

Current plans are to refurbish three science labs, two computer labs, the elementary restroom, and add air conditioning to the kitchen area.

Additional needs identified include: portable classrooms, technology needs, parking lot resurfacing, up grading/maintaining bus fleet, other restroom/classroom refurbishing, playground equipment, and general maintenance.

**\*Has there been any consideration to use income surtax instead of property tax?**

Yes, the school board discussed this option. The total cost of these refurbishing projects will be approximately \$300,000. To complete these projects by next school year the school will need to work with a financial institution to borrow the money for the project and use the PPEL funds generated yearly to pay off the loan. School districts may borrow against future PPEL funds if funded by property tax. School districts may not borrow against funds funded by income surtax.

## Local Teacher Presents at Regional Reading Conference

Hinton first grade teacher, Mrs. Jan Heimgartner, recently presented at the regional Reading Recovery Conference in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Her presentation, "Using Word Walls in the Classroom", was attended by educators from at least five states.

A word wall is a wall on which to display important high-frequency words. Recognizing these high-frequency words helps children to read; being able to spell them will help children become better writers. In her presentation, Mrs. Heimgartner focuses on the importance of students interacting with the word wall through short daily activities. Mrs. Heimgartner has introduced the concept of word walls at numerous area schools' in-service training, as well as Western Hills Area Education Agency.

Mrs. Heimgartner has also been asked to present at the state Reading Recovery Conference in Des Moines in February.





## Teacher In-Service

On Monday, October 23 the faculty of Hinton Community School participated in an in-service involving a multitude of activities directed by Mrs. Jane Krehbiel, Curriculum Coordinator. Superintendent Mr. Steen began the day with a discussion of our district needs and budgetary concerns.

During the morning session, K-3 teachers visited Washington School in Sioux City to meet with and observe individual teachers regarding the guided reading program. Kathy Perret from Area 12 discussed literature circles with grades 4-6, Title 1, Special Education, and Elementary Guidance.



Teachers in K-12 divided into subject area disciplines to address various topics of interest. Language Arts explored the STAR Program (a diagnostic program on the computer in association with the Accelerated Reading program), Math and Social Studies participated in web-site exploration to locate valuable sites for both teacher use and as a student resource. Science instructors reviewed the ITBS/ITED content as it pertains to classroom assessment vocational, physical education, foreign language, and fine arts instructors explored the technical aspects of digital camera use and its application to the curriculum.



The late morning session was held in the school library where the faculty was divided into three groups. K-6 reviewed the STAR Schools Grant and NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association). Dan Hudek, 7-12 guidance counselor, shared information with 7-12 staff regarding portfolio assessment.

The Technology Committee met with David Attrill to review the tech plan and discuss staff development and infusion of technology into the curriculum. The afternoon session involved discussion of character education and its place in the school curriculum. Teachers were divided into K-6/7-12 teams for this activity.

## High School Science

With our first snow fall field trips to Hillview Park and leaf collecting expeditions to Marland have come to a halt. Course of studies have turned to the classroom for what we hope will be a great winter of science.

The biology classes are now starting unit on cell structure and function. Any study of life (biology) must include a study of cells, their structure and function. Because cells have many structures and functions in common a definition and description would seem to be a simple matter. However, the variations in specialization and organization can make an in-depth study complex. Students will be learning some historical background that will help them to understand the findings that led to the development of the cell theory. Structures that are common to most cells are discussed individually, highlighting structure and function. Material movement into and out of cells is the next item discussed, followed by cell specialization and organization that exist in multicellular organisms.

Chemistry students will be finishing a unit on atomic structure. Here, using a historical approach, students will be identifying the atomic theories, subatomic particles, and basic ideas about the structure of atoms. Nuclear structure and radiation will also be introduced in the unit. This unit will set the groundwork for our next unit on electron clouds and probability, quantum mechanics.

Advanced biology students will be completing their unit on the chemistry of life. These students will be reviewing atoms and elements and examine some basic chemistry principles. Most importantly they will be examining the role of carbon in living things. They will learn about the structure of carbohydrates, lipids, proteins, and nucleic acids and how these compounds are important to organisms.

The days are flying by, fall sports have been completed and the winter sports are just starting. Semester tests and Christmas must be close at hand. Just a reminder to parents that semester tests are not just for students with an excessive amount of absences and tardies. Semester tests can also be voluntarily taken. This would be good practice for your college bound students.

## “Up the Down Staircase” Performed for Full Crowd






## Picking Up Students at School Dismissal Time

\*Lori Lorenzen welcomed everyone to the meeting and reviewed the agenda for the evening.

\*Sub-committee reports were given as follows:

Enrollment trends show that budget enrollment has been increasing over the past ten years. There are peaks and valleys, however, overall it has been increasing. There appears to be a history of a "bulge in the middle grades of 4-8". In checking with the Sioux City Schools, they think they will be building either a new elementary or middle school on the north side of town. The official recommendation is due to their board on November 28.


The technology sub-committee reported several recommendations for the school district to consider. The vision for technology is to "Create a classroom environment that is technologically rich, where students and teachers use technology to communicate ideas and information." Points of emphasis include remaining flexible due to the fast paced changes in technology, implementing technology exploratory modules in the middle grades, and to expand the secondary technology offerings.

The economic trends/by pass sub-committee reported having difficulty obtaining information the impact of a by pass will have on outlying communities. The committee did find a report for the City of Hinton showing that growth is predicted and the people that live in Hinton have above average incomes.

\*Al Steen updated the facility committee on the board initiative to pass a physical plant and equipment levy to fund improvements in science labs, computer rooms, elementary restroom, and kitchen area.

\*A discussion was held as to what the committees should do next. Discussion centered on the use of a consultant and what data is still needed. It was decided to take time to "digest" the information presented and to continue the discussion at the committees next meeting.
